- 7.) New Business: 14535 Killion Street. 6 unit Small Lot Subdivision. This lot currently has a large Spanish style house on it. The plan is to demolish the house and build 6 units each having a two car garage. Three units on each side with the driveway down the middle. Each unit having a roof top deck. Applicant is requesting 3 1/2' exemption to the existing 30' height allowance to accommodate railing on rooftop. Five neighbors spoke against the project. All felt it was too height, not well designed, not suited for the neighborhood.

The committee was concerned by the lack of community outreach that has occurred. Since the site is zoned for this project, working with community to come up with a better looking project is to everyone's best interest. Applicant seemed willing to redesign the project so as to suit the neighborhood better.
