Newly elected Members will be seated after certification of the final election results, or in the event of a recount or election challenge, after confirmation of the results of that recount or election challenge, in which case incumbent Members will continue in their positions until any recount or election challenge is resolved.

<u>Members elected or appointed to terms expiring in 2018 shall serve one additional year, and</u> <u>members elected or appointed to terms expiring in 2020 shall serve one additional year, due to a</u> <u>one-time extension of terms per City Council Ordinance.</u>

Beginning with election held in <u>2019</u>, and each election thereafter, each and every Member shall be elected for a four (4) year term, or until a successor is elected or appointed."
