Having a Voice in Our Community

The voters of Los Angeles passed a new City Charter in 1999.

The City Charter calls for a citywide system of independent neighborhood councils, chosen by the people of the neighborhoods themselves.





Purpose

NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCILS' PURPOSE OVERALL

Promote public participation in City governance and decision-making process so that government is more responsive to local needs and requests.

Neighborhood Councils will advise the Mayor, City Council, and City Departments on the City budget and will give local residents greater say over the decisions that affect our lives.

A mission represents the fundamental reason for the organization's existence: what it is, what it does, and how it does it.




Our SONC Mission

- Take any other action that is, or may be, authorized for neighborhood councils of the City of Los Angeles

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





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IN 1927 SHERMAN OAKS BEGAN AS A LAND DEVELOPMENT ENTERPRISE


To that end we propose carefully designed and coordinated sequences of public spaces creating a sense of community that asserts the value of the public realm and urban fabric over the individual structure.






Encourage in private development art ideas.


Public Realm/Public Spaces

- 4. All building must be LEED Gold or higher.
- 5. More small green spaces t/o commercial areas.

Growth is going to happen; we might as well manage it!






Maintaining R1 zones

Protect (e) single family and low density neighborhoods from encroachment; incompatible uses.


















Sherman Oaks Demographic Highlights

- 1. Total population: 70,400
- 2. 69% are between the ages of 18 and 65
- 3. 40% own their residences; 60% rent
- 4. 69% are White, followed by White Latino (9%), Asian (8%), and Black (6%)
- 5. 91% speak English only and speak it "very well"
 - Others speak Spanish (10%) or other languages (7%)
- 6. 41% have bachelor degrees or higher and 28% have some college or an associate degree
 - 12% are high school graduates; 4% have no high school diploma
- 7. Mean household income: \$116,800
 - 26% earn >\$100,000
 - 14% earn <\$24,999</p>
- 8. 8% have disabilities
- 9. SONC elections: 154 in 2016




Stakeholders & Community **Assets Grid**
