4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

Our project will feature the creation of a 7-12 minute film which honors a resident of Sherman Oaks. The resident will be partnered with a creative team comprised of a composer, lyricist, director, and dramaturg to dramatize and musicalize events in their life. New Musicals Inc. develops musicals for the live and digital platform. Our team will help shape the honoree's story into a 7-12 minute musical theatre piece on a digital platform. This program focuses on "ordinary heroes" whose perspective on life is interesting and enlightening. Some examples that we are considering for this project are: the inspiring patience of the elderly gentleman who paints and re-paints the often-graffiti-targeted circus artwork at Circus Liquors in North Hollywood; the librarian(s) whose work has become as much social work as education; sewer workers; paramedics and "front-liners," recent immigrants, et cetera. The series is as diverse as our fellow citizens.

Stipends would go to the honoree, and all the writers and artists associated with the program would receive compensation. Additional funds would offset the cost of cameras, lights, greenscreen studios, editing, etc. (Plus an additional costs for health/safety.)

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

Our series will focus on ordinary people. Our goal is to show someone else's perspective. We think it's important to stand back every once in a while and walk in someone else's shoes. In these extraordinary times, many of our neighbors have shown astonishing resilience, tenacity, and determination to stay true to their personal pathways. Empathizing with our neighbors through the form of musical theatre will bring the community closer because we will better understand one another. Our 10- minute films celebrate the life choices someone has made, for better or worse, and perhaps along the way we learn from someone else's triumphs and/or failures. We have been awarded a grant from the Northeast North Hollywood and will be featuring a member from their community. We are requesting a grant from the Sherman Oaks Neighborhood Council in order to feature a member from your community. The start date for the Sherman Oaks honoree is open, since this episode would depend upon the Neighborhood Grant funding.

We are requesting a Neighborhood Purpose Grant in the amount, not to exceed, \$5000 to purchase 2x Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Staging Area Kits to be placed within the SONC boundaries.

The CERT Staging Area is the location where trained volunteer community responders and members of the Neighborhood Emergency Team will go to after a disaster such as an earthquake. From here, they will form Damage Assessment Teams and assess the neighborhood surrounding the Staging Area (approximately 1 mile or 10 blocks) and communicate any incidents back to the Staging Area using two-way radios so that a coordinated response can be made. CERT Liaison Teams will establish two-way radio communications with the CERT Staging Areas and the LAFD response.

The CERT Staging Area Kit gives responders everything they need to get the response operational for the first 3 hours including providing tested, reliable radio communications instead of relying on volunteers to bring their own, and maps of the area. Yearly exercises will be planned out of this Staging Area to give CERT volunteers a chance to practice the plan, and to test and maintain the equipment.

During a disaster, when professional first responders are not available, you and your neighbors become the volunteer disaster responders who will save lives in the community. History has shown that communities that organize and train regularly, for community disaster response, recover faster and are less impacted than communities that do not. Logistically, in a city the size of Los Angeles, this organization and training must come from community by the community.

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training is taught for free by the Los Angeles Fire Department, but does not have the resources to organize the community. Neighborhood Emergency Teams are truly grass roots in origin, organized and made up of volunteers who have taken training and have chosen to step up, often investing their own money into equipment, supplies, and additional training and certifications.

The Community Disaster Preparedness Foundation 501(c)(3) (CDPF) was founded by volunteer CERT Coordinators from all over the City of Los Angeles to help organize and support Neighborhood Emergency Teams where, due to logistics, the Fire Department and the City cannot.

The Neighborhood Team Program (NTP) is managed by the CDPF and focuses on creating step-by-step guides and how-to-guides to help create, organize, and train Neighborhood Emergency Teams, identifying the location for and arranging the setup of CERT Staging Areas, and providing training and guidance to Neighborhood Emergency Teams on how to organize and respond to disasters.
