## **Neighborhood Purposes Grants**

Neighborhood Purposes Grants (NPGs) provide NCs opportunities to develop partnerships with local 501(c)(3) nonprofits and public schools to build community and enhance neighborhoods in the City of Los Angeles. Projects and activities supported by NPGs vary widely and can include, but are not limited to:

- The Arts
- Beautification
- Community Support
- Education
- Community Improvements

NPG-funded projects and activities must be for a *public benefit* and purpose, **open**, *accessible*, and *free of charge* to stakeholders.

Grants approved by NCs exceeding \$5,000 involve further review and possible City contract by the Office of the City Clerk.

There are two NPG Information Packets; One for prospective applicants to help guide them in the application process, and one for NC board members outlining considerations and factors to keep in mind while evaluating NPG requests.

A "Project Completion Report" template is also provided to help ensure accountability in the use of Grant funds and help demonstrate how NCs and their partners are supporting L.A. communities and stakeholders. NCs and NPG recipients are strongly encouraged to work together to complete and submit the Report at the conclusion of the project.

#### SECTION II - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

4) Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant.

Teachers in primary grades use classroom rugs for a variety of purposes. These rugs get used daily and in no time at all they are worn down and extremely dirty. Students bring a variety of elements to the rugs, sometimes it's just dirt while other times they have accidents. The rugs have barely the life of one year, but many of them are used for many years before they are replaced. It is time for many of the rugs at Chandler to be replaced. We hope to be able to replace the rugs on a rolling basis so that they are kept up to date and in relatively good shape. The better conditions the rugs are in the healthier and safer our kids will be.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

The students will benefit from the awarding of this grant as it will provide them more opportunities to move around in the classroom. Instead of being stuck at their desks the entire day, teachers will be able to have their students come to the floor at the front of the classroom and participate in a variety of different activities. These rugs can provide a comfortable space for students to sit, if students are engaged in activities that require sitting on the floor. By using rugs with specific colors or patterns, teachers can create a sense of order and structure. For example, certain colors might designate where students should sit during circle time or group activities.
